#### **SUMMER AT THE POOL**

Buy your summer pool pass by April 15 before prices increase!

After a successful partnership with Bolton Valley, the department is now preparing for summer swimming lessons and visits to our municipal pool! Pool Director Heather Lessor will again be leading all pool activities this summer. The Town of Waterbury is a proud provider of Starfish Swimming Lessons, a nationally certified swim instruction curriculum. Lessons will operate throughout the summer and are also part of summer camp, a new addition this year. Information about swim lessons will be posted by mid-April.

#### **PARK PROJECTS**

Waterbury Recreation, Public Works Department, and community organizations are preparing for park maintenance and projects as the weather turns. We will be updating Hope Davey Disc Golf Course in accordance with the 2023 Master Plan, Hope Davey Playground area, tilling the Community Garden locations, launching a Children's Garden in partnership with the library, maintaining of our playing fields, and much more. Spring and summer are our busiest seasons.

Specifically at the Hope Davey Disc Golf Course, we will be updating holes 9, 12, and 13. These holes will be modified to protect wildlife, maintain good neighbor relations, and support the community feedback from the Master Plan process. The course and nature trails are closed until the beginning of May. The community can enjoy the course changes at the end of spring when mud season has (hopefully) subsided.

Spring is also the time when we get back out on our playing fields. If you are interested in joining a team, please check out our facilities calendar and reach out to the organizers. If the organizer is not clear, connect with the Recreation Department and we can help.
